

# Digging Deep: Gaining a Better Understanding of Diseases, Disorders, Diagnosis & Treatments Currently in the News

Each member of the following alphabetized list, whether a disease, treatment, or problem in our environment, deserves a full understanding: Alzheimer's disease, Attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder, Autism, Chronic fatigue syndrome, Endocrine disruptors, Fibromyalgia, Hallucinogenic drugs as therapy, Impotence, Incontinence, Prediabetes, Prehypertension, and Stem cells. This course will describe the basic characteristic represented by each, try to provide the most current scientific evidence regarding their validity, importance, or problems so the student will gain a more comprehensive perspective.

Fred Abramson, PhD. received his A.B. in Chemistry from Western Reserve University in 1962 and his Ph.D. in Chemistry from Ohio State University in 1965. After two years of postdoctoral experience and five years in industry, he joined the Pharmacology Department at The George Washington University School of Medicine in 1972 and retired after 31 years on the faculty. He holds a long-term interest in transmitting science to the general population. He taught in continuing education programs soon after moving to La Quinta in 2004. Teaching science to non-scientists has become his passion. UCR Osher instructor since 2023.

#### **Bob Dylan**

Explore the life one, music, and lyrics of Bob Dylan, one of America's most enduring artists. Born Robert Allen Zimmerman, Dylan has been a major figure in popular culture for over 50 years. Emphasis will be on his work of the 60s and 70s when he wrote most of his well-known folk and rock songs including "Blowin' in the Wind" and "Like a Rolling Stone." Learn how the young troubadour, poet, author, and politcal activist evolved into the artist who ultimately won the Nobel Prize for Literature.

Mark Guerrero led the popular East Los Angeles band Mark & the Escorts, who recorded two singles for GNP Crescendo Records. Mark has also recorded as a solo artist for Ode Records, Capitol Records, and with his group Tango, for A&M Records. His songs have been recorded by Herb Alpert, Trini Lopez, Chan Romero, and his late father, Lalo Guerrero, "known as the Father of Chicano Music." As a Chicano and East L.A. music historian, Mark has written over a hundred articles, hosts a podcast, interviewed hundreds of artists, consulted for museums, and lectured at universities.

#### Dark Silhouettes: Private Eyes and Police Detectives in Film Noir

According to Raymond Chandler, "Down these mean streets a man must go who is not himself mean, who is neither tarnished nor afraid. The detective in this kind of story must be such a man." Together through lecture and class discussion we will examine how well this ideal holds up as we watch and evaluate plots, major themes and key characterizations in the following six classic film noir movies squared off against one another as follows: The Maltese Falcon (1941) vs. Kiss Me Deadly (1955); The Big Sleep vs Chinatown (1974); and Detective Story (1951) vs. L.A. Confidential (1997).

Butch Epps has received his MFA degree from the UCLA Department of Film and Television's Independent Producers Program where he focused on story development and working with screenwriters. He also served as the academic liaison to high profile professional faculty, including studio heads, development executives, and others. Butch has taught over 30 film appreciation courses in the Coachella Valley over the past 9 years while developing a book - his magnum opus - on Orson Welles's Mercury Production of *Citizen Kane*.

#### Between the Wars - The U.S., 1918-1941

This six-week course examines key events, issues, and personalities of the 1920s and 1930s. In the "Roaring Twenties" the United States experienced an economic boom, which included much technological progress; in the 1930s it suffered through the worst economic depression in its history. The nation experienced much rapid cultural change during this period, but saw much conservative reaction in response to that cultural change as well. Politically, the election of Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1932 and the implementation of his New Deal significantly altered the relationship between American citizens and their government. Finally, in the late 1930s, as Europe drifted into another world war, the American people grappled with its implications for them. Whether one's interest is economics, popular culture, politics, or American foreign relations, the interwar period is a fascinating one.

Bob Ellingsen (M.A., U.C. Riverside, 1991) taught history at the high school and community college level for over thirty years. In addition, he has taught three OSHER classes in U.S. History the last three winter quarters, dealing notable American presidential elections, the 1920s and 1930s, and the "home front" during the Second World War.

#### **About**

UCR Retirees' and Emeriti Associations and UCR Osher present Professor Emeritus Larry Wright. His dissertation and most of his earliest work concerned teleological explanations, culminating in a monograph that helped spark a minor literature on the topic, but he has more recently devoted his time and energy primarily to investigating the relation between the concepts of argument and explanation, and the illusions generated by our competence with them. What should we expect of abstract reflection? A scarred veteran's meditation on the hopes and hazards of philosophical inquiry.

# Pentagon Papers: Commemorating a 50th Anniversary



#### Friday, May 12 3 - 5 pm | online via Zoom

On May 11, 1973, in the trial of United States v. Anthony Russo and Daniel Ellsberg, Judge William Bryne, Jr. ruled on the defense motion for a dismissal of all charges against the defendants based on the government's gross misconduct. The court learned two weeks earlier that burglars had broken into Ellsberg's psychiatrist's office at the direction of the White House. Byrne granted the motion, writing that "the bizarre events have incurably infected the prosecution of this case." In a two-hour online presentation, Osher instructor John Powers will lead an exploration into the events surrounding the drafting of the Vietnam Study, the so-called secret history of United States involvement in Southeast Asia, and its disclosure to the print media in June 1971. The public revelation of the Pentagon Papers will lead directly to crimes by the Nixon Administration and to the resignation of the President.

John Powers, M.F.A., is a writer and director with experience in theater and film. Drawing on recent U.S. history as source material for a number of his productions, he has also developed this material into provocative classroom engagements, such as *Nixon and the Pentagon Papers*, 1968: The Year That Rocked, and Pearl Harbor Reconsidered.
