



Great Connections: Bridging the Continental Divide – A Documentary Course

How did America become a country connected from sea to shining sea? This course will look at pivotal events that connected the country from coast to coast but manifested America's destiny as a 20th century global power. Watch and discuss Lewis and Clark: The Journey of The Corps of Discovery, The Oregon Trail: The Story of One of History's Most Amazing Migrations, The Transcontinental Railroad, Horatio's Drive: America's First Road Trip, and The Panama Canal: Gateway to The American Century.

Butch Epps has received his MFA degree from the UCLA Department of Film and Television's Independent Producers Program where he focused on story development and working with screenwriters. He also served as the academic liaison to high profile professional faculty, including studio heads, development executives, and others. Perspectives on Death & Dying

From DNR's, Wills and insurance to grief and recovery, to care giver and care giver burnout to suicide prevention, this course will focus on the many perspectives we can take about death and dying. Investigate how the burial rites vary from Islam to Santeria to the Quaker religion. End the course with an exploration into NDE's (Near Death Experiences) and OBE's (out of body experiences).

Investigate the causes of this decline and what it might mean for the future of the economy and US society broadly.

Workshops: Range from successful aging, financial wellness and creative activities.



Issues include affirmative action, racial and political gerrymandering, regulation of Native American adoptions, the extent of immunity for websites, student debt relief challenges, and more. The Supreme Court has issued very few opinions on argued cases as of May 17, 2023. The number of significant decisions that will be released through June 30 will be historic.
